WHAT IS NATURAL RUBBER?

Natural rubber is derived from the sap of certain plants, predominantly the Hevea Brasiliensis tree.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS TO THE TIRE INDUSTRY?

Natural rubber is critical to manufacturing safe and durable tires.

Durability

Natural rubber is critical for all tires as it serves to provide durability. Certain tire performance can only be achieved through the use of natural rubber.

Performance

Commercial and military aircraft tire treads are almost completely made from natural rubber because synthetic rubber cannot perform in this application.

Unique Properties

Natural rubber is also the main component in heavy duty truck and bus tire treads due to its unique properties.



WHY DOES THE U.S. NEED A DOMESTIC SUPPLY?

Over 90% of current natural rubber supply originates in Southeast Asia.

The rubber tree is very susceptible to disease.

Loss of this supply chain from Asia would exacerbate supply chain issues in the U.S., affecting tire production and defense capabilities.



ALTERNATIVES TO HEVEA NATURAL RUBBER

The two most promising natural rubber producing plants to use in developing a domestic supply of natural rubber are guayule and TKS (dandelion).

Domestically Available

Both plants can be grown in different parts of the U.S.

Performance

Both plants provide equivalent performance to Hevea natural rubber in tires.

Economical

Both plants contain valuable co-products which serve to reduce the cost of rubber.



HOW TO DEVELOP A DOMESTIC SUPPLY

Incentivize the needed investments to help farmers adapt to planting rubber-producing crops.

Scale commercial processing facilities to extract the rubber and co-products from the plants.

Increase investment into public research of other domestic alternatives to Hevea natural rubbers.
